They thought Jesus was going to be King and save them from the Romans.

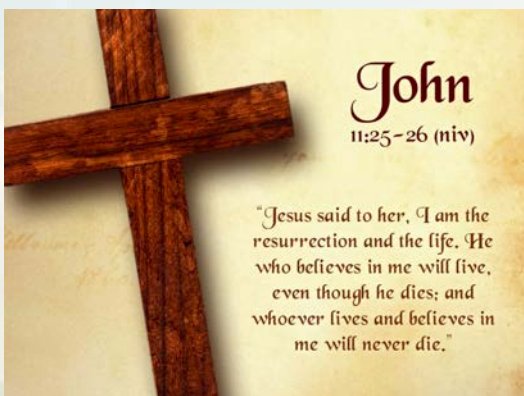

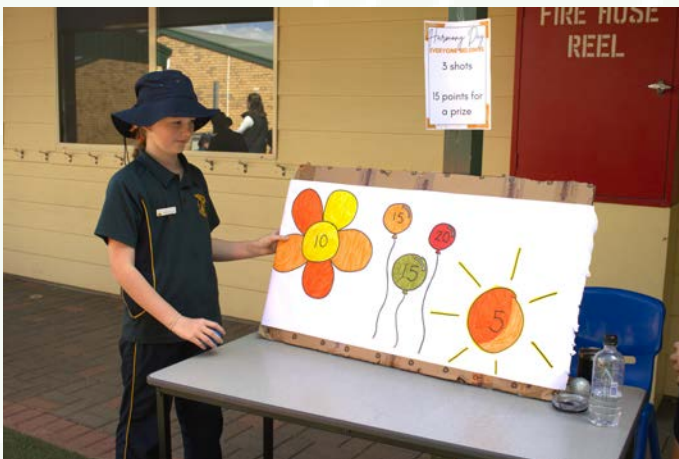


